 Meetings are due to take place between partner organisation including the NHS and CCG regarding the health provisions of the development. It was noted that there were a number of partner organisations that need to work together to ensure the best possible outcome for the development. David Wilson Homes to date had completed 83 homes with 46 	
 currently occupied. 173 starts had also been made.	
Developer Contributions (KBC)	
Louise Holland presented a report relating to the use of developer contributions.	
 To date £1,324,000 had been received from David Wilson Homes, this had been provisionally allocated as follows: The design/construction of Junction (C) at windmill Ave/Deeble Road £600,000 Cranford traffic calming measures £63,000 1st and 2nd repayment with regards to the loan to build the primary school at Hayfield Cross £625,000 	
 Since the last forum in June, a payment for Quarter 3 had been received from David Wilson Homes. 	
 £500,000 had been paid to the County Council toward Junction (c) works and the first two repayments of the school loan, £500,000 has been made to the Homes and Communities Agency. Commitments at this time are a further £100,000 for Junction (c) and Cranford Village Traffic Calming (£63,000) 	
 It was anticipated that a further £330,000 will be received in the 2017 calendar year. This money will be spent on further repayment of the primary school loan. 	
- The primary school account at mid July 2017 stood at £5,045,943.	
- The Council had attracted funds from other sources, which will enable some additional works to be progressed.	

17.EKLF.18	QUESTIONS		
	Q. There are reports of developers building on the boundary of the development between 92 and 96 Warkton Lane, what is being done to correct this?	A. David Wilson Homes have submitted revised plans to include the 'buffer zone' as an area to build on, at the moment no changes have been accepted and these plans are currently being looked at. The developers had erected illegal sheds on the area in question and this was considered unacceptable as planning permission had not been given.	
	Q. Would the time for traffic to move be reduced with the introduction of a new pedestrian crossing thus increasing the number of cars waiting?	A. The signals included with the proposed junction would operate in different phrases to include the pedestrian crossing. Traffic would still be able to turn right into Cranford Road and left into Barton Road whilst pedestrians crossed.	
	Q. If there was not constraints that included land, cost or utilities, would junction g look and operate differently?	A. Unfortunately we have to work with what we have at the moment and the proposed designs for the junction are the best available to us. And would be a significant improvement for the highway and for the capacity of the junction.	
	Q. Work needs to be carried out along Warkton Lane/St Catherines Road Junction as cars are constantly speeding along this road causing a massive risk to drivers wishing to turn out.	A. Solutions are currently being looked at. Plans will be brought forward.	

Q. When will proposals for the junctions at Pytchley/ Barton Road be brought to the forum?	A. Designs are currently being finalised and so a detailed report will be provided at the next forum to give a better idea of what is being proposed.		
Q. When will works be carried out on the new proposed changes to the Cranford/Barton Road junction?	A. At the moment there is no set time as we are waiting for potential triggers to occur involving Section 106 funding from the developers.		
Q. Can the remaining funds be allocated in cooperation with Cranford Parish Council to fund gateways to the village.	A. This is certainly something we would look into and be happy to discuss with the Parish Council. Although legal agreements would have to be consulted upon prior to any formal discussions. Q. Can anything be done to connect the school to the mains telephone lines as the school currently has to use mobile phones to contact parents.	A. Permanent utilities will be constructed when the new access road is constructed on the development site.		
Q. can you confirm the current capacity and maximum capacity of the school?	A. The School currently teaches just under 200 pupils but this number is due to increase to a maximum of 420 pupils when all year groups are at capacity.
