I act on behalf of the Chief Officer of Police Mr Edens, he has delegated responsibility and authorised me to act on his behalf with regard to representations made by Northamptonshire Police to Licensing Authorities across the county of Northamptonshire.

I call for the Review of the Premises Licence for Aqua under the Licencing Objective of the Prevention of Crime and Disorder.

This Review will relate to the premises and contain details of incidents of disorder associated with the premises, person(s) under the age of 18 years being on the premises, and concerns in relation to the management of the premises.

The Premises Licence Holder for Aqua Mr Surrinder DUGGAL has been the Designated Premises Supervisor at this location since June 2014, however it was in March 2015 that Mr DUGGAL transferred the Premises Licence to be also in his name from the Free Holders details.

At this time the Premises Licence authorised regulated entertainment and the sale by retail of alcohol.

Sunday to Wednesday 11:00am to 02:00am close at 02:30am.

Thursday to Friday 11:00am to 04:00am close at 04:30am.

Saturday 11:00am until 05:00am close at 05:30am.

In November 2015 Mr DUGGAL applied to vary the Premises Licence from its current timings to the following hours for regulated entertainment and the sale by retail of alcohol.

Friday to Sunday 11:00am to 06:00am close at 06:30am.

Monday to Wednesday 11:00am to 02:00am close at 02:30am.

Thursday 11:00am to 04:00am close at 04:30am.

This application was not objected to by Northamptonshire Police, however discussions took place between the applicant's representative's in respect of a dispersal policy to be implemented when the premises closes at the weekend at 06:30am.

Since the implementation of the new hours granted Northamptonshire Police have noticed a number of incidents that have raised concern that the Licensing Objective of the Prevention of Crime and Disorder is not being promoted.

- 1) On the 6th of November 2015 at approximately 06:45am Police Officers attended the area of Silver Street to a report of a domestic related incident involving a male and female. Whilst dealing with this incident it was established that the female was 17 years old and admitted to Police Officers that she had been drinking alcohol within Aqua prior to this incident. Police Officers describe the female as being intoxicated, it was also noted that at this time there were still people in the street outside Aqua who were 'drunk' in their expert opinion.
- 2) On the 6th of March 2016 at approximately 04:15am two males were assaulted in the rear garden area of the premises, this incident was captured on the premises CCTV system and there were frustrating issues obtaining this CCTV from the owners of the club at the time. The alleged offender(s) for the assault it has been suggested are known to the owners and Officers dealing with the incident believe that to be a reason for the CCTV not forthcoming initially but it is accepted that it was provided. The CCTV has been viewed and is at this stage part of a live investigation, however what can be said is that the offenders are standing with the manager of the venue when the assaults take place. The CCTV shows the manager carrying one of the victims of the assault who was knocked unconscious out of the garden area and place this person in the alley next to the venue. The manager then

- closes the gate back shut and proceeds to stand with the offenders talking to them.
- 3) On the 19th of March 2016 at approximately 00:15am a male was observed by the Council CCTV to enter Aqua, this male had previously been issued with a Section 35 order to leave the town centre by Police Officers. On attending the club as the male would have committed an offence by breaching this order he was found in the company of a female. This female did not have ID to confirm her age as the Officers suspected she was underage from her appearance. However the male stated that she was 17 years old, when the management were spoken to about this female Officers report that the response was 'oh well' and did not appear to be concerned.
- 4) On the 28th of March 2016 Police Officers were dealing with a female who had been reported missing, it transpired that the female was last seen in Aqua, her friends were concerned about her whereabouts and reported the matter to the Police. Once located during the day the female was invited into the Police Station to be interviewed about where she had been. During this interview it was discovered that she had been in Aqua, she had no ID on her and was not asked for any when entering the club, the female is 16 years old.
- 5) On the 16th of April 2016 at approximately 05:30am a male was ejected from the premises by the Door Supervisors. In response to this the male has on him an incapacitant spray (Pepper Spray) and uses it against the Door Supervisors, this male is arrested after a foot chase with Police Officers.
- 6) On the 17th of April 2016 at approximately 03:40am a male was observed by the Council CCTV operators to enter Aqua, this male had been issued with a section 35 order to leave the town centre by Police Officers. The male had also attempted to enter another licensed premises earlier in the evening as although the male had produced ID at this premises the ID illustrated that the male was 17 years old. Police Officers attended Aqua and removed and arrested. It was noted by the Police Officers that the Door Staff did not seemed bothered that they had let this male in and had to be asked twice by the Police for assistance in removing the male from within.
- 7) On the 22nd of April 2016 at approximately 03:30am a male was observed by Police Officers 'staggering' along the street towards Aqua. In the Police Officers expert opinion this male was drunk, the male was observed to enter Aqua with no attempt to challenge the male at entry by the Door Supervisors.
- 8) On the 24th of April 2016 at approximately 06:00am customers were exiting the premises and this created a large crowd in the street. Fighting broke out between some members of the crowd and it was reported that the Door Staff were nowhere to be seen in attempt to

either break up the fight or implement the premises dispersal policy.

9) On the 24th of April 2016 at approximately 07:00am another fight broke out outside Aqua this report came from the Council's CCTV operators, on arrival by Police Officers one male was located with what the Police Officers describe as serious injuries, this male has been identified as being involved in an altercation with the owners brother. CCTV will show Door Supervisors and the DPS standing by watching and making no attempt to intervene in stopping and preventing the assault from taking place.


Northamptonshire Police have concerns that conditions contained within the Premises Licence are not being adhered to or upheld. There are concerns that disorder is occurring due to the late times of licensable activity coupled with the closing time. It is well documented that the later a premises trades into the early hours the greater the risk that the licensing objectives will be undermined in particular in relation to town centre venues which are predominately HVVD (High Volume Vertical Drinking) venues. In addition that person's under the age of 18 years are being allowed access to the venue with no verification checks being made.

It should be noted that a further evidential package will be submitted to the Licensing Authority and the Premises Licence Holders prior to the hearing and in line with the Licensing Act Hearing Regulations. In addition Northamptonshire Police will be in a position to explain points 1 to 9 contained within these papers further and how they impact on the Licensing Objectives and contravene conditions contained within the Premises Licence for Agua.

Northamptonshire Police will be asking the Committee to consider a number of options should they be of the opinion that the Licensing Objectives are not being promoted,

- 1) That the Premises Licence be revoked.
- 2) That the Premises Licence has all licensable activities reduced to 03:00am.
- 3) That the Designated Premises Supervisor be removed.

Northamptonshire Police have looked at any further conditions that could be considered to promote the Licensing Objectives, however the existing Premises Licence already contains numerous conditions to which Northamptonshire Police cannot suggest any further. In addition existing conditions are being breached so there is no value in additional conditions be added.
