Title	Enforcement Action Monitoring		

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

To present to Committee a report on enforcement monitoring covering the reporting quarter of 01 July 2016 to 30 September 2016 and updates the position as at 28 October 2016.

2. <u>INFORMATION</u>

Planning enforcement decisions are determined by the Head of Development Services who could refer enforcement matters to the Planning Committee if the action is significant or controversial. Any non-urgent enforcement matter could be 'called-in' by Ward Members who are being/ will be informed of any proposed action, recognising that sometimes urgent action eg a Stop Notice, may be required.

This update follows the format and scope of information for enforcement monitoring reports which the Planning Committee have agreed to be suitable for the purpose. This report will identify the numbers of cases opened, closed and remaining writing as well as action taken up to the date of writing (28/10/16)

3. OUTPUT AND PERFORMANCE MONITORING

- 3.1 The response to a complaint involving a Priority 1 is same day or as soon as practically possible, the service standards for a first response to a Priority 2 and a Priority 3 are respectively 14 and 21 days.
- 3.2The number of complaints on hand by end of October 2016 (complaints that may give rise to enforcement action) are up slightly since the beginning of July but currently still remain below 100 which remains manageable, though a further lowering of this figure is the focus. At the same time outstanding cases identified in July have been the subject of further action (see below) and new cases also have proceeded to formal enforcement action.
- 3.3 For our customers to have confidence in the ways in which KBC responds to the issues raised remains, a core value.

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3.4 For the reporting period 01 July 2016 to 30 September 2016, and the latest position, the number of cases that had been received or closed and the numbers on hand were:

3.6 Formal action between 01 July 2016 and 28 October 2016

Legal action has continued with a further High Court Hearing on 27 July 2016 in respect of an unauthorised Gypsy and Traveller pitch (24b) at Greenfields, near Braybrook.

The injunction relating to this site has in effect been suspended and further action will be determined after the outcome is known of the Planning appeal heard on 23/24 August 2016.

(NB The other Planning Appeal Hearing to examine the refusal of 9 No applications for Gypsy and Traveller pitches on the bottom (southern half) of Greenfields was postponed in August but is now due to commence on Wednesday 9th November 2016).

A Temporary Stop Notice was served in August 2016 in response to the unauthorised demolition and works at 77 Polwell Lane (a planning application regarding this is reported elsewhere on this agenda). Breach of Condition Notices were also served in regard to two sites, and other

Planning Contravention Notices (PCNs) were served in August 2016 in regard to the complaints about the Old Willows Travellers site at Broughton. This is subject to discussions with the agent pending possible further formal action

Finally, Breach of Condition Notices have been served in relation to two new cases (at 90g High Street, Burton Latimer, and 28 High Street, Kettering) as well as in regard to the continuing non-compliance at 4 Springfield Close, Kettering

3.5 Enforcement, Stop Notices (issued after April 2012) and other actions against unauthorised development: Outcomes Update for period 01 July 2016 to 28 October 2016.
