## 20.BC.01 WELCOME

The Portfolio Holder for Finance welcomed members of the public and councillors to the meeting.

The meeting was informed that Kettering Borough Council must fulfil its statutory duties in setting a budget within a medium-term financial strategy, notwithstanding the future of local government in Northamptonshire. It was noted that legislation had now been laid before parliament in respect of a unitary council for North Northamptonshire and was expected to become law during the early part of 2020.

A presentation was given outlining the Council's Current Budget Position (2019/20) the Draft Budget Proposals for 2020/21 and the key issues facing local government in the medium term. The presentation covered the :-

- General Fund
- Housing Revenue Account and
- Capital Programme

Following the presentation, the Portfolio Holder for Finance summarised the current financial position regarding local government reorganisation in Northamptonshire. The Council along with all the Northamptonshire authorities, is due to contribute up to a further £1.9m to the Future Northants Programme in the next financial year (2020/21), making a total contribution of up to £2.4m when added to this year's contribution. It should be noted that this would be funded from reserves and not from the Council's General Fund budget. If the Structural Change Order for Northamptonshire was approved, the financial and operational environment would need to change as the year advanced. The Portfolio Holder for Finance summarised some of these changes and it was noted that Council's guiding principles may also need to be revisited.

It was stressed that climate change considerations were now threaded through all activities of the Council.

The meeting was informed that comments from the budget consultation process including this meeting and meetings of the Geographic Forums, the Monitoring and Audit Committee, the Research and Development Committee and the Tenants' Forum would be reported back for consideration by the Executive at the meeting on 19<sup>th</sup> February – these would also be reported to the Full Council meeting on 26<sup>th</sup> February.

An opportunity for individual questions was then given and attendees advised that written comments may also be sent to the Council for consideration by the Executive at the February meeting. It would be preferably if these were submitted early to allow these to be sent out with the Executive papers prior to the Executive Committee meeting on 19<sup>th</sup> February.

It was noted that the presentation slides would be available on the Council's website from tomorrow (24/01)
