19.EKLF.21	The Timeline for Delivery, Action Plan and Infrastructure Updates were given verbally and in a presentation to the Forum as follows:			
	<u>Developer Update</u> – Hanwood Park			
	lan Troughton of Hanwood Park LLP provided an update regarding ongoing works taking place across the Hanwood Park site.			
	<ul> <li>Works were progressing with regards to the surfacing of the western side of the carriage way but further unforeseen service works needs to be undertaken due to the lowering of certain areas of the road.</li> <li>Access E works are due to be completed subject to ongoing surface work in December 2019, although it was reported that due to a potential embargo put in place by NCC over the festive period this may be pushed back to January 2020.</li> <li>Initial works have been carried out at Access F with telecom diversionary works. BT services had caused a slight delay due to their diversion of services.</li> <li>Other works had been completed at Cranford Road following the 20<sup>th</sup> August deadline which was met prior to the school opening.</li> <li>Gas works are due to commence on the 20<sup>th</sup> October</li> <li>Discussions were currently taking place with developers with regards to the installation of a footpath link across the parcels, significant drainage and landscaping work was required before any further action can take place.</li> </ul>			
	<u>Developer Update</u> – David Wilson Homes/Barratts			
	Pritesh Shah and Tom Nightingale of David Wilson Homes attended the forum and gave an update relating to Parcels R7, R9 & R10			

- To date construction had been started on 346 properties within the Warkton Lane/Deeble Road site.
- 308 properties had been completed since construction began on the site in 2016.
- Sales remain strong across both developments with 64 homes being sold since the start of 2019.
- Over £2.5 Million had been paid in S106 payments to Kettering Borough Council
- A Reserved matters scheme was due to be submitted to Kettering Borough Council in the coming months

#### **Developer Update - Persimmon Homes**

Lucy Walden of Persimmon Homes attended the forum and gave an update relating to construction across the Persimmon site

- To date there were 16 occupations across the Persimmon site
- It was projected that 10 units per month would be constructed at the current rate
- £1.5 Million had been paid in S106 payments to Kettering Borough Council
- Cranford Road works had been completed apart from the installation of street lighting which was due to take place imminently to connect the system to the main network.

#### **Highways Update**

Kingsley Cook of Northamptonshire Highways attended the forum and gave an update relating to off-site junctions.

An update with regards to the Warkton Lane Traffic Calming was provided which stated that the project would be completed in early 2020 once works have been completed on neighbouring roads to minimise disruption to the road network. Final costings were to be confirmed which would be delivered using S106 funding.

It was confirmed that works in Cranford Village had been carried out and that design work had commenced on off-site cycle paths between Junction 10 of the A14 and the end of the existing cycle path on St Botolph's road.

Initial works in relation to a number of off-site junctions continued but to date no timescales were available, once confirmed more details would be provided to members of the forum.  A Stage 3 safety audit had also been carried out in relation to the junction realignment work at Cranford Road. Guard rails and resurfacing had also been installed due to safety concerns at the school.	
NCC Education Update	
<ul> <li>Chris Wickens of Northamptonshire County Council Education provided an update with regards to ongoing works to the Hayfield Cross School site.</li> <li>The last inspection with regards to the temporary road has taken place on the 30<sup>th</sup> September 2019 with representatives from NCC and the school highlighting areas that needed urgent attention. Contractors will be undertaking the relevant surface works during the School Holidays to minimise disruption.</li> <li>Northamptonshire County Council reiterated its obligation to supporting the school including the installation of permanent internet facilities which would be taking place in the future.</li> <li>Discussions had taken place with local education providers regarding the secondary school planned for the East Kettering development</li> </ul>	
Planning Update (KBC)  Gavin Ferries provided an update relating to the developments across the East Kettering Site:	
<ul> <li>Discussions were taking place with Hanwood Park with regards to new outline planning permission for the East Kettering site as the current permission has conditions which require the reserved matters (detailed elements) to be submitted for approval by 31 March 2020.</li> <li>As part of future planning submissions to the Planning Authority, a scoping report is to be request in which local/ national statutory</li> </ul>	

consultees will be asked regarding whether or not the prospective planning permission will be likely to have any environmental impact. The scoping process does not consider the planning merits of the scheme.	
Developer Contributions (KBC)	
Louise Holland presented a report relating to the use of developer contributions and provided the forum with an update relating to the developments across the East Kettering Site:	
<ul> <li>To date £4,300,000 had been received from developers this had been provisionally allocated as follows:         <ul> <li>The design/construction of Junction (c) at Windmill Ave/Deeble Road £600,000</li> <li>Cranford traffic calming measures £70,000</li> <li>Repayments with regards to the loan to build the primary school at Hayfield Cross £3,661,000</li> <li>Construction of Junction (g) Cranford Road/Barton Road £686,000</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	
- A Contribution of £880,000 had been received from Persimmon Homes which was to be used to deliver the junction improvement works at Cranford Road/Barton Road (Junction g).	
- Since the last forum in March 2019, a payment for Quarter 2 2019 had been received from David Wilson Homes.	
£537,000 had been paid to the County Council toward Junction (c) works and the eight repayments of the school loan, (£2,661,000) had been made to Homes England (Formerly the Homes and Communities Agency) and £65,000 for Cranford village traffic calming including gateway feature. Commitments for 2019/20 at this time are further repayments of the school loan. Junction improvement works are another key priority and funds are being set aside for this purpose.	
- The primary school account end 31st August 2019 stood at £3,267,995.84.	

	- The Council had attracted funds from other sources, which will enable some additional works to be progressed including that for traffic calming at Warkton Lane/St Catherine's Road and offsite junction design works.

	Q. When works are carried out across the development and on significant junctions can these be done outside of peak times to avoid major disruption on the roads?	A. NCC had a duty to ensure that the road network is moving as efficiently as possible and any future works would be done in a way to minimise disruption		
	Q. Who is responsible for the temporary Traffic Lights on Barton Road? Several houses have driveways leading onto Barton Road which causes delays and backlogs with vehicles, can anything be done to delay the changing of the lights?	A. The Developer and the subsequent contractor are responsible for the traffic management systems in place on Barton Road. There has to be a fine balance between allowing enough time for traffic to move along the route and for drivers not to queue jump	Hanwood Park / NCC Highways	
	Q. Can more guard rails be provided along the school route as there is several dangerous obstacles and banks that could cause harm should a child fall into them?	A. Due to budgetary issues NCC are unable to accommodate the installation of any further guard rails so KBC has paid for the installed railings from s106 contributions		

Q. Chevron vehicles that monitor the traffic management system do so with their engines running, can this be fed back?	A. This will be fed back to the developer/contractor	Hanwood Park	
Q. I am disappointed at the lack of progress with the footpath to the school, this needs to be treated as a priority as we were promised that the path would be installed by September	A. The proposed footpath is in the boundary of the Taylor Wimpey development and so there is a major ditch that needs works doing before any path can be installed. There will be continued dialogue on trying to accommodate a pedestrian access to the school from the DWH site as soon as is possible.

#### 1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

In accordance with the Section 106 Agreement for East Kettering, to set out the source of, and use of, developer contributions.

#### 2. INFORMATION

- 2.1 The S106 Agreement requires an annual statement to be published, regarding the utilisation of S106 monies, to show where they have been raised from and how they are to be used.
- 2.2 It is the intention to produce a statement for every meeting of the Forum, rather than just annually.
- 2.3 The attached statement (**Appendix A**) shows the monies that have been received to date.
- 2.4 To summarise the attached statement, to date, £5.9m has been received which has been allocated as follows: -

•	The design/construction of Junction (c) at Windmill Ave/Deeble Rd	£600,000
•	Cranford traffic calming measures/gateway/drainage works	£70,000
•	Repayments re the loan to build the primary school at Hayfield Cross	£4,261,000
•	Construction of Junction (g) Cranford Road/Barton Road	£686,000
•	Kettering Town Centre Environmental Improvements	£75,000
•	Community Development Worker	£25,000
•	Junctions/other works	£75,000

2.5 Since the last forum, a payment for Quarter 4 2019 has been received from David Wilson Homes and Persimmon Homes.

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- 2.6 With regard to expenditure £537,000 has been paid to the County Council toward Junction (c) works and £70,000 for Cranford village traffic calming/gateway scheme. Repayments of the school loan totalling £4,261,000 have been made to Homes England. Commitments currently are further repayments of the school loan, payment for Cranford Road/Barton Road (junction g) junction works (completed), other junction/highway works, Town Centre Environmental Improvements and Community Development Worker.
- 2.7 The primary school account at 22<sup>nd</sup> January 2020 stood at £1,750,366.22 so this will remain the focus for S106 spend in the short to medium term.
- 2.8 The Council has attracted funds from other sources, which will enable some additional works to be progressed; for example
  - Traffic calming works at Warkton Lane/St Catherine's Road
  - Offsite junction design work.
