#### Passive smoking

#### Smoke-free workplace

"Ireland, Norway and New Zealand have each passed laws to ensure all enclosed workplaces are smoke free. How strongly, if at all, would you support or oppose a proposal to bring in a similar law in this country?"

Strongly support a smoke free law 54%
Tend to support 35%
Neither support nor oppose 8%
Tend to oppose 7%

## Opinion poll (Tobacco Manufacturers' Association)

### Results from a survey for the Tobacco Manufacturers' Association

| Adults agreeing that smoking should be banned in pubs, clubs and bars                      | 17% |

| Adults feeling that smoking situation in pubs, clubs and bars has improved in recent years | 86% |
| Adults noticing an increase in non-smoking areas in recent years                           | 73% |
| Adults who felt further improvements are needed  | 75% |
| Better ventilation   | 24% |
| Increasing non-smoking areas   | 16% |
| Banning smoking at the bar to protect workers  | 4%  |
| Banning smoking  | 17% |

"Many prefer a more flexible approach (than a ban), the most popular options being more non-smoking areas (19%), a real choice of smoking policies (10%), or leaving it up to the management (9%). There is relatively little public support for national or local government regulation of smoking in public places, which is advocated by less than a quarter of the total sample."

| Results from a survey for The Guardian  |     |

| Adults wanting an outright ban on smoking in public places  | 20% |
| Adults wanting restrictions on smoking where there are likely to be children  | 92% |
| Adults supporting pubs being mainly non-<br>smoking with designated smoking areas   | 51% |
| Adults supporting pubs being mainly smoking with designated non-smoking areas   | 19% |
| Adults in favour of a complete ban on smoking in public places  | 20% |
| Adults supporting no restrictions on smoking  | 8%  |
