




Income

Housing Revenue Account

- ◆ Target is for 100% of dwellings to meet decent homes.
- Each £1 in rent results in 30p subsidy payment to Government.
- For every £1 of rent increase paid by our tenants a further £1.12 will be paid to Government.
- A £9m service therefore costs £12.6m.
- Rent Increase proposal 3.1% in line with the draft subsidy determination.
