Why you should have your say:

Northamptonshire Police, like every other public service, are going to have to make large financial savings over the next 3–4 years, and we are looking at ways in which we can provide an effective service to the public with fewer resources.

In the last 8 years we have already made £39 million of savings, including efficiencies in back office roles, such as within Finance and Human Resources. We have also returned Police Officers who were previously undertaking back office duties to front line roles.

However, we can only reduce these back office roles to a certain level, as their support is required to ensure the Force is run effectively. That's why we need you to have your say on how further savings can be made.

How to get started:

- This pack has been developed so that you can feed back views from different groups that you might attend, such as parish meetings and residents associations, or from your own friends and family.

List of policing priority definitions

Hate crime:

Any crime or incident which is perceived by the victims or any other person to be motivated by a hostility or prejudice-based on a person's actual, or perceived, race, religion or belief, sexual orientation, disability or transgender.

Counter terrorism:

Understanding and stopping the risk of terrorist threats to Northamptonshire and the country.

Stopping the use and dealing of illegal drugs.

Working in partnership to keep people safe on Northamptonshire's roads.

Domestic abuse:

Working in partnership to tackle threatening behaviour, violence or abuse between family members or adults in a close relationship.

Anti-social behaviour:

To focus local policing on preventing and tackling anti-social behaviour such as noise nuisance, drunk and rowdy behaviour etc.

Serious organised crime:

Including tackling drug smuggling, cannabis factories, people smuggling and fraud.

Burglary:

Preventing and investigating crimes involving breaking and entering a buildina.

Violence with injury:

Violence resulting in harm to an individual, including serious assaults, sexual offences and robbery.

Violence without injury:

Crimes involving actual or perceived violence but where no physical harm is caused, e.g. threatening behaviour, verbal abuse or harassment.

Vehicle crime:

Preventing and investigating crimes related to theft of, or from vehicles.

Criminal damage:

Preventing and investigating offences involving intentional destruction or damage to another person's property.
