  - comprehensive refurbishment projects
  - planned replacement of building elements such as roofs, windows and boilers.
- plays an important role in improving the quality of life for tenants
  - environmental improvements
  - Security projects



#### Aims

- To ensure that council housing continues to fulfil a key role in the local housing market;
- To ensure that the housing stock meets tenants' aspirations and remains easy to let;
- To ensure that council housing in Kettering continues to meet the Decent Homes standard;
- To improve energy efficiency and reduce fuel poverty;
- To create better communities by enhancing the appearance of housing estates and minimising opportunities for crime and anti-social behaviour.
