Title	Amendments to the Scheme of Delegation to the Head of Development Services		

## 1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek the Committee's authorisation for the delegation of powers to the Head of Development Services to take all and any action with regard to planning enforcement matters and other minor planning matters.

## 2. INFORMATION

- 2.1 The Council's Constitution currently provides that all enforcement matters are to be determined by the Planning Committee. The Committee is asked to consider amending the Constitution and delegating enforcement powers to the Head of Development Services.
- 2.2. The consideration of enforcement matters has recently resulted in a number of extra items on the normal planning agenda taking up committee time on increasingly complex and lengthy agendas.
- 2.3 It is usual for such powers to be delegate to officers to allow the Committee to concentrate on the major applications, it is also beneficial to the enforcement process as it allows officers to respond quickly in enforcement matters and reduce the burden of administration in preparing reports for Committee. This would not prevent the Head of Service referring enforcement matters to the Planning Committee where considered appropriate if the action is significant or controversial, nor would it prevent any enforcement matter being 'called-in' by Ward Members for committee consideration as has always been the case. Members would be informed of any enforcement action proposed in their ward and it is proposed that the Committee would receive quarterly reports on any enforcement action taken in that period.
- 2.4 Under the Constitution Full council is responsible approval of any changes after consideration of the proposals by the Executive. The Committee is asked to recommend the changes to Part 3 of the Constitution as set out in Appendix C to the report.
